2015 has been another year of adventure for us with some sad news to begin: Rommel (the wonder dog) died in March at the age of 11 1/2 years. Ranger's an active guy with a strong, friendly personality and a slightly less aggressive nature than typical German Shepherds.

As always, most of our news is about the boys. Sam is now a sophomore at Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. He spent part of his summer with an F&M professor and small group of students studying in Russia. They visited St. Petersburg, Moscow, and a small rural village. He had a great experience and learned a lot about Russian culture in his interaction with Russian college students, even spending an evening with the family of one of them. He also had a week of intensive physical training in Miami learning Krav Maga with an Israeli Commando instructor Dave knows. Sam went with a high school friend and came back with new, practical self-defense skills. Sam continues to perform with the F&M concert and pep bands. He's also playing Ultimate Frisbee on the club team at F&M. They had fun at a Spring Break tournament in Myrtle Beach. He was home briefly at Thanksgiving and we're looking forward to having him for the longer winter break.

Ben is now in a very active part of his junior year at Freedom High. Marching band took up much of the fall and now overlaps with wrestling, where he competes at 170 pounds. He continues to be active in Scouting and is spending more time with a Venturing crew, a co-ed branch of the Boy Scouts for older scouts. His girlfriend Kelly is also active in this crew and they are both leaders in the National Youth Leadership Training program that will happen over winter break. Sam will also help to conduct this program, which they took a few years ago. Ben made two big trips with Scouts this year. Last summer, he was a delegate to the National Order of the Arrow Conference at Michigan State University and went on a 10-day backpacking expedition at Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico where they hiked over 70 miles. Ben got his regular driver's license and was surprised with a new Jeep. Unfortunately, after only 3000 miles, he was hit from behind, pushed into another car, and then rolled on his side.
